The School Improvement Council (SIC) is mandated by the state of South Carolina for the purpose of overseeing the school renewal plan and acting in an advisory role to the school's administrative team. Each year the SIC is charged with making an annual report to the school's community. Included in this newsletter you will find important information about the school and the progress and challenges that we face in our school improvement efforts.

The school again received a Palmetto Achievement award based on state testing. The rating validates the work and commitment of the school and the SIC to student achievement.
